MLSC TREASURERS REPORT 2023 - 2024 SEASON

I would like to give thanks to the many members who have taken on roles to support and grow the many facets of the Mornington Life Saving club.

A quick summary of our financial position as at 31 March 2024:

CASH POSITION: Balance of \$297,866 as at 31st March 2024 up from \$270,651 last year.

INCOME: for the year was \$340,541 – a \$40k increase on the \$300k from last year.

Membership income was \$5k lower than last season, mainly due to slightly lower numbers.

Membership: Total \$77,056

- This was a 6% decrease on last season. Numbers dropped mainly in the Associate members (60 members) and Nipper's categories (24). However, this is still a substantial increase of 18% from our pre-covid membership in 2019 (\$65,196).
- Special thanks to Nicole Warner who provides enormous support club-wide on registrations, all grant applications, equipment purchase fulfilment, payment approvals amongst a long list of other activities.

Grant Income: received \$67,917 compared to \$34,259 last season, if a significant uplift due to the VESEP grant.

• Thank you to Life Saving Victoria, SLSA, Bendigo Bank Mt Eliza, Mornington Peninsula Shire, and the Victoria State Government.

Kiosk & BBQ: Income of \$5,305 down from \$53,205 last year (please note there were some adjustments carried over from prior year of approx. \$5k which negatively impacted the current year)

- We trailed an outsourcing arrangement for canteen operations this year while this has resulted in a significant drop in revenue it has substantially reduced the pressure and distraction on the club. We are currently identifying a new provider for the coming season.
- Special thanks to John and his growing team, Anthony, Kristy for their continued efforts to source produce, run setup and pack up and provide support (and the delicious sausage sangers!).

Schools Program: Income of \$57369, up from \$40,612 last season.

• Thank you to Jac Morrow, Angie McGough, Kate Quinn, Mark Cornish, Kelly Parrish, and all the team for coordinating the Program.

Water Training Fees: Income \$8,786 was down from \$15,600 last season due to lower numbers and a variation in how transactions were recognised within PayPal.

 Thank you to Ange Seaburgh, Adrian Lynch, Jeremy Warner, Travis Sutton, Simon Williams, Damian Brice, Adam McCrow, Michael Egan and especially Matt & Lisa McConnell for all your coaching support. The results speak for themselves.



• Thanks also to the youth instructors. It was great to see our teenagers continue to help train the nippers. For many of them this is their first job, and they did a fantastic job overall.

Uniform: Income of \$38,032, up from \$13,708 last season.

• A fantastic effort in her first year by our merchandise manager Liz Bailey, who managed all the purchasing, inventory and sales on behalf of the club.

EXPENDITURE: Year End \$282,585 compared to \$275,280 last season.

• A great job by the team to controlling expenses given the increase in income and activity at the club this season.

NET SURPLUS/(DEFICIT) for Year: \$57,955

 We are a not-for-profit club and aim to put all earnings back into the club to enhance our members' experience and provide a valuable service to the community. The current year surplus allows the club to build our resources to undertake some longer-term investment in facilities, equipment and capabilities to deliver a better member experience and community service.

I would also like to thank our Club Admin Nicole Warner who continues to provide tremendous support to the committee and all members alike, while securing financial grants to assist with the club's growth and equipment.

Lastly to our members. I would like to thank you personally for being part of the Mornington Life Saving Club and the passion and support throughout this season.

Financial

We welcomed a new Treasurer in Duncan Short for the 2023-24 season who has provided great financial guidance and helped to deliver another strong result for the club,

- Income \$340,541
- Net Result \$57,955
- Cash Position \$27,215
- Cash on Hand \$297,866

Membership

The club continues to be in a strong position with 1,028 members including 138 active patrol members. Our nipper program continues to flourish with 364 Nippers for the season and our senior program continues to grow with 84 Seniors.

Patrol

We welcomed Nicola McKinnon as the new Club Captain for 2023-24 season taking over from Terry Shrimpton who had led the club for 5 years. This season saw a change in structure with 4 patrol groups created to streamline awards and provide cover for our vital volunteer network. Key statistics for the year include.

- 138 team members patrolled Mills Beach over the summer
- Averaging 24.6 hours per patrol member
- 40,297 people attended Mills Beach through 3,410 patrol hours in a summer that was late to show up
- 365 preventative actions occurred
- 16 Minor First Aids were attended to
- 3 major rescues occurred through the season
- 51 days on patrol

Training

Stewart Lockie and his training team continued to deliver the best training on the Mornington Peninsula. Thank you for dedicating your time and effort to support our youth in pursuing Life Saving, and for upskilling our members who have completed their Bronze Medallion, allowing them to patrol Mills Beach and continue their journey. A notable highlight was the significant number of new Drivers and Crew, who took the step to become a key part in the life saving operations of the club thereby enhancing our patrol groups with additional resources.

Nippers

Jeremy Warner began his journey as Nipper Captain in 2023-24 taking over from Angela Seaburgh who was in the role for the previous 3 seasons. Our Nipper program for under 6-13 commenced in November, engaging 364 participants across 16 sessions until March, delivering enjoyable beach activities and essential water safety skills to the next generation. We had a solid competition team with 117 Nippers representing the Green Machine at carnivals throughout the season including 47 at the LSV State Junior Carnival held at Warrnambool in hot conditions over the March Long Weekend.

Many thanks to the 34 Age Managers and Administrators who did an outstanding job in delivering another successful Nipper program, and to the parent helpers each week whose assistance ensured the sessions ran smoothly. Congratulations Jeremy on your first season as Nipper captain and delivering a successful program.

I would also like to thank Liz Bailey who came onboard this season to run our uniform store, open every Sunday with a team of helpers delivering our uniform needs for the whole club.



Seniors

The Senior program, led by Senior Captain Simon Williams, continues to go from strength to strength, offering a dynamic blend of summer training and events that both our youth and senior members enthusiastically participated in. This year our senior program grew again with 84 seniors with a mix coming from our strong junior program and new arrivals to the club.

Thanks to the Hendy family who again managed the difficult task of fitting senior mals and ski's into the limited storage space we have available.

We were also thrilled to acquire three new Race One adjustable skis, offering enhanced opportunities whilst providing the best equipment on the market for our expanding senior group. We now have 7 competition quality single ski's and two doubles to continue to build the momentum of our ski team.

Sporting Success

The season began with 5 weeks training leading into the annual Mooloolaba pre-season camp in September. We had 184 members in attendance with over 110 training made up of Nippers, Seniors and Masters.

Our competition team had another successful year, with Nippers and Seniors participating in all carnivals, including the Victorian Junior State Championships at Warrnambool and the Victorian Senior Championships event at Ocean Grove. It was another fantastic outcome by our Nipper States team of 47 athletes that finished 4th in the State and only a handful of points off 3rd. It was also an impressive performance by our Senior team of 32 athletes finishing 5th in the State without the addition of Boat Crew points. Well done all.

Our coaching team, led by Harriet Brown as Club Coach and Youth Mentor, provides support and guidance for both our Junior and Senior programs. Harriet designed all mid-week training sessions and is present at Mills Beach throughout the season.

Matt McConnell led our senior coaching group again with sessions throughout the week across Ski, Board, Swimming, Iron and Running. He was well supported by Simon Williams and Adam McCrow who ran a number of sessions each week including a number at Gunnamatta to improve our surf skills. Open water swimming was well attended with Lisa McConnell, Jeremy Warner and Ange Seaburgh at the helm. We welcomed Carly Platt as our Beach and Running coach for the season who took our beach athletes to the next level which was testament by the strong results through carnivals and at states. Shane Tatham supported Carly and provided great guidance with the Belt & Reel which also saw strong results throughout the season. Travis Sutton continued as our Nipper Coach and did a fantastic job preparing our Juniors throughout the season and Adrian Lynch continued in the role of Competition Coordinator assisting with mid week coaching and making sure the Nipper Competition team was ready to perform at every event.

Thanks also to our Senior Administration Kelly Parrish and Nipper Program Admin Michael Egan who fulfilled the important task of organizing all roles through a full competition season.

One standout moment of the year was witnessing 27 of our Senior team elevate their performance and compete at Aussies on the Sunshine Coast. It was an incredible event with over 8,000 competitors showcasing their skills. Congratulations to all our athletes who represented the club admirably in challenging conditions across various events. It was particularly rewarding to see several competitors reach national finals— a sensational effort and testament to the hard work and months of dedicated training.

Schools Program

This season, Jacqui Morrow managed our school's program fantastically, demonstrating great skill in handling challenges such as inclement weather and water quality issues arising from nearby council amenities issues. Her adaptability ensured the continued success of this highly regarded program. Even with these challenges a successful program was delivered with all schools rebooking for next season at the completion of their session. Some key statistics include;

- Mon Fri Program running Term 4 and Term 1
- 20 Schools participated
- 50 days scheduled
- Number of Students attending the program 3,196
- Revenue delivered \$40,340

Fund Raising

In order to maintain equipment and keep vital programs running within the club fundraising continues to be an important function of the club. Our BBQ was led by Anthony Sacker and BBQ John, assisted by all age groups on a rotation basis to keep the hungry Nippers fed after a big Sunday morning on the beach. The team delivered a fantastic result this year with \$14,802.50 generated through this initiative. Thank you, Anthony, John and team.

The Twilight Swim was another great success, this season led by Rich Morel. We had a record 348 swimmers on a great night at Mills Beach where the weather was kind with the event contributing \$19,720 via registrations. A big thanks to Rich and the army of helpers that make the event a key date on the calendar with great feedback from participants.



We were able to secure \$67,917 in grants for the year that enabled us to upgrade vital life saving equipment for the patrol team. We were also able to secure a grant to purchase an Isuzu DMAX 4x4 vehicle to assist with patrol operations as well as towing equipment to competitions around the state and country. The visibility with the club logos on the vehicle also assists in driving awareness of the Mornington Life Saving Club in the local community and beyond.

I would like to thank all our sponsors for the 2023-24 season and look forward to partnering again in 2023-24. Please reach out if there is a way you can help support the club for the season ahead.

Summary

MLSC NIPPER CAPTAINS REPORT 2023 - 2024

Our Nipper Program commenced on November 12th with an Open Day. It was a fun day for new nippers/families to visit, tour the club, and participate in a nipper's session. They gained an understanding of the program and a feel for what lifesaving means.

This year we had two dates for the compulsory swim assessment.

The day before the open day Saturday 11th November & Saturday 18th November the day before the first Nipper Session. This year we ran 15 weekly nipper sessions. Most were on Sunday mornings with 2 Friday twilight nights. We also offered an intensive holiday program between Christmas & New Years.

This season we had enhanced engagement with the local Community through the Emergency Service Visits. We had Sunday visits by the local fire crews.

Our littlest nippers loved climbing in the fire truck and were even allowed to assist with spraying the fire hoses out into the water. Nippers often do not understand that lifesaving is an emergency response – Just like the police or Fireman and Firewoman. It was a great fun way to teach this. Having the Fire truck was a highlight of the season.

Enhanced Sustainability practices were achieved through our visit from Matt from MMF Marine Litter Project. This was a fun and interesting opportunity to demonstrate long-term protection and conservation of marine mammals and their environment. Matt and team started with the Under 6's and worked their way up the beach to the Under 13's providing a hands-on discussion around connection to the environment, via appreciation of our amazing marine mammals.

The MLSC nipper program this season had over 350 participants, making the program needing an army of volunteers to succeed.

I would like to personally thank all these volunteers for their help with the program this year. Their dedication to helping nippers learn & develop surf lifesaving skills was outstanding and so important for the success and enjoyment of the program.

Parents were actively encouraged to join training sessions to increase fitness and progress to Bronze certification.

The BBQ was again a great success playing a vital part in raising money to put back into the club with Nippers Parents being rostered on each week.



Each nipper session started with me giving a presentation with a summary of the past week's events and information on what would be coming up in the following week.

Each nipper group had their own team app group with notification about upcoming events, info Facebook groups with notifications and achievements were posted.

There were 6 new admins that joined the teams this year who did an outstanding job informing and passing on info when signing nippers in and out each week. Also ensuring that the BBQ rosters were filled.

This season a preventing injuries seminar took place at the club.

This workshop involved nippers from u8 to Under 13's, seniors, with their parents. We had several medical personnel including Physiotherapists, Nurses, a Podiatrist, a Nutritionist and an Orthopaedic surgeon, who each presented a short session on injury prevention, in relation to their field of expertise.

It was great to hear from experts who spoke in age-appropriate terms, that the kids could relate to and learn from.

The club was unfortunately hampered by the South East Water Sewage spills into Tanti creek and subsequently into Mills Beach. Despite the beach being closed due to poor water quality, our teams did an amazing job of running land only activities where required and used the time for alternative training instead of cancelling the Sunday sessions & mid-week training.

The last day of nippers was a special day for the club seeing out our outgoing U13 group. Every nipper from u6 to U12 and the age managers, assistants and coaches formed a guard of honour at the beach entrance. The u13's then entered the beach for their last session. Kids cheering all the way down the line and quite a few teary-eyed parents, an extremely fitting way to include every nipper in a grand send off for the u13's.

Presentation night for our u9 to u13 occurred in May at Gravity Zone with over 200 attending. It was a great way to have fun while also acknowledging the great nipper's season. This is also where the year's awards were handed out.

Our Under 8 to Under 13 Nippers that competed at carnivals this year really did do the club proud. Coming away with a 4th overall for the year is an outstanding achievement and should be an indication of not only how hard working and skilled our Nippers are but how dedicated the huge team of coaches and parents are to make the program the success it is, in turn enabling our young Nippers to achieve their dreams and goals within this sport.

I'd like to thank Ange Seaburgh for her ongoing support this year, her knowledge of the nippers program is immense and she has been invaluable to me in my role.

I would also like to thank Damian Brice for his support and guidance this year and would like to acknowledge the tremendous amount of work he has done to help make the club what it is today.
